M.F.A., Ability to build significant exhibition record within discipline is required with teaching experience beyond graduate school preferred. Significant research in fine art photography emphasizing strong digital photography skills, ability to teach digital to analogue hybrid processes, and knowledge of alternative processes a plus. Expertise required in Adobe Lightroom and Adobe Photoshop. Comprehensive knowledge of the Photographic medium required with a commitment to emerging technologies and current discourses in critical theory. Successful candidates must be committed to working effectively with diverse student populations. Applicants are expected to describe their commitment to fostering a diverse educational environment through their research, teaching, and/or service activities. Grant writing skills not required but preferred. Grant writing skills preferred. M.F.A. candidates and recent graduates are encouraged to apply.

RESPONSIBLITIES:

The candidate will teach all levels of Photography, maintain the photography studio, and demonstrate a commitment to teaching excellence. The candidate will also engage in creative research and professional development; participate in departmental programs and activities, academic advising, service expectations, and work with colleagues to assess and improve curricula and demonstrate institutional citizenship through active engagement at the department, college, university, community, and professional levels.

FACILITIES:

The Photography studio facilities include separate large and small format digital printing labs with accompanying scanners, a traditional wet darkroom equipped for 35mm, medium, and large format printing, and private darkrooms for faculty, intermediate, and advanced students. Additional equipment such as lighting kits, reflectors, and tripods are available for student checkout.

DEPARTMENT:

The Department of Visual Arts is NASAD accredited. The Department has 19 full-time faculty and 6 part-time faculty, more than 350 majors in 9 concentration areas (computer art and animation, ceramics, graphic design, metalwork and jewelry, new media and digital art, painting, photography, printmaking, sculpture) within an integrated curriculum leading to a B.F.A. degree in Studio Art.
