Position: College of the Arts Curator of Events and Exhibits **EEO# AR 4-15**

Responsibilities: Reporting directly to the dean, this 12-month person will be Curator of Exhibitions for the College of the Arts in various venues in and around Fletcher Hall, Angelle Hall Auditorium Lobby, and other venues on campus. He/she will coordinate the COA community engagement and outreach activities. Finally, he/she would curate the Festival of the Arts including its signature event, ArTech Fusion. Includes writing and managing grant proposals where needed and appropriate, securing sponsorships for exhibits and events, and promoting exhibits and events.

Qualifications: Bachelor's degree with curatorial experience. MFA preferred. Record of effective grant writing and implementation. The successful candidate will have professional knowledge of exhibition design and promotion. Professionalism, collegiality, and excellent organizational and communication skills are essential.

Salary: Salary competitive and commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Facilities and Resources: The College of the Arts is one of eight academic colleges. It is multi-disciplinary with programs in visual arts, architecture and design and music and performing arts. It has 90 full-time and part-time faculty, 900 undergraduate students, and 60 graduate students. It occupies 5 buildings across campus.

University/Region: The University of Louisiana at Lafayette is a public research university with High Research Activity with accreditation from the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges. With an enrollment of over 18,000 students and 575 full-time faculty members, UL Lafayette is the largest of nine universities in the University of Louisiana System. The University offers degree programs in 54 undergraduate disciplines, 20 post bachelor certificates, four graduate certificates, the master's degree in 27 disciplines, and the doctorate in 10 disciplines.
