Position: Assistant Professor of Public Relations (**EEO LA 9-14**)

Qualifications:

Candidates should have a doctorate in public relations or a related field. Teaching experience and at least three years of experience as a public relations professional are highly desirable. Writing for public relations and Associated Press style teaching experience preferred.
