Position: Instructional Technologist **EEO No. AA 10-16**

The University of Louisiana at Lafayette invites applications for the position of Instructional Technologist, a member of the Instructional Support team in the Office of Distance Learning. Reporting to the Instructional Support Manager, the Instructional Technologist will provide technical management, training, and advanced support of the Office's instructional technology. Instructional Technology tools - lecture capture, web-conference, academic integrity, content authoring, and collaboration tools - support teaching and learning in the online environment.

Responsibilities:

The Instructional Technologist:

- **Advocates for technology innovation**
 - Evaluates requests, makes recommendations, and executes strategies for improvement and expansion of instructional technology tools.
 - Coordinates selection and piloting of instructional technology.
- **Investigates and supports instructional technology**
 - Administers instructional technology tools, user access, and usage.
 - Troubleshoots technology issues and coordinates with IT and vendors to ensure timely and successful resolution. Tracks results.
 - Maintains detailed knowledge of instructional technology features and functionality; tracks progress of new and pending developments.
- **Communicates best practices for using instructional technology**
 - Develops and facilitates technology support content through a variety of media (video, web, documentation, and face-to-face delivery).
 - Supports compliance with student privacy, accessibility, academic integrity, and other institutional policies involved in the applications of instructional technology.
- **Demonstrates using technology to create an innovative teaching and learning environment**
 - Participates in the creation and delivery of faculty professional development on best practices for teaching and learning with technology.
 - Guides faculty, staff, and students in the implementation of instructional technology based on contemporary best practices.
- **Facilitates collaboration among instructional technology users**
 - Collaborates with instructors, designers, and other users to support and coordinate instructional technology use.
 - Coordinates learning communities and user groups to share experiences, ideas, and best practices for using instructional technology.

Qualifications:

Education: Bachelor's degree (Master's degree preferred)

Experience: Three years' experience in technology management, training, and advanced support. (Experience in online education preferred.)
