Qualifications

- Doctorate preferred, masters degree required
- Experience at the collegiate level and public school teaching experience are highly desirable. Credentials should demonstrate effectiveness in attracting and retaining instrumental music and music education students.
- The applicant should possess outstanding skills as a conductor and marching band director, and have an outstanding reputation in the field.
- The candidate should possess communication skills sufficient to function cooperatively and collegially with the entire faculty and staff of the school, college, and university. Credentials should demonstrate organizational, motivational, and communication skills suitable for recruiting and maintaining a highly active and visible athletic band program.

Successful candidates must be committed to working effectively with diverse student populations. Applicants are expected to describe their commitment to fostering a diverse educational environment through their research, teaching, and/or service activities.
