RESPONSIBILITIES:

We are seeking candidates with a proven academic record, who will be active educators in their field. The normal teaching load for an instructor (12-month position) is 4 to 5 course sections a semester during the academic year and up to three courses a summer. Instructors also participate in departmental, service and undergraduate student advising activities

QUALIFICATIONS:

A master's or Ph.D. in Mechanical Engineering or closely related field, preferably with a B.S.M.E. from an ABET accredited program, is required for appointment as an instructor. We seek applicants with expertise in any area of Mechanical Engineering or a closely related field. Related teaching, industry experience, and professional licensure are all highly desirable.

Note: Successful candidates must be committed to working effectively with diverse student populations. Applicants are expected to describe their commitment to fostering a diverse educational environment through their research, teaching, and/or service activities.

UNIVERSITY AND COMMUNITY:

The Department of Mechanical Engineering is one of five engineering departments in the College of Engineering. The department has a very strong ABET accredited undergraduate program and a growing graduate program. Annual research expenditures in the department exceed \$1.3M a year, with primary focus areas in renewable energy, energy conservation, robotics biomedical devices, HVAC systems and combustion. The College of Engineering has over 2,900 students and offers degrees from the B.S. through Ph.D. in all engineering departments. The Carnegie Foundation has designated UL Lafayette as a "Research University with High Research Activity."
