

POSITION: Compliance Manager, Regional Application Center (RAC)

RESPONSIBILITIES:

The Compliance Manager will have overall operational and management responsibility in overseeing LANG Geospatial Haz/Waste data management and visualization projects at the Regional Application Center (RAC). He/she will manage the activities of those staff members under these directives, including accounting, communications, field work and appropriate staff as assigned to these projects. He/she will work as technical lead on these identified LANG projects and agreements; in their execution and implementation and ensure the final technical products are delivered successfully. He/she will also be responsible for day-to-day collaboration with all members of the staff assigned to LANG Haz/Waste Geospatial data management and visualization projects to achieve identified objectives. More specifically, as the compliance manager will:

- Plan, direct, coordinate, and lead activities of identified LANG contract projects to ensure that goals, objectives and all elements are accomplished within the prescribed time frame and funding parameters and report to the RAC Director.
- Be responsible for technically leading and building visualization and data management and field applications as needed to successfully deliver the final products as per the contracts and maintain compliance with all military and state regulations.
- Establish work plan and staffing for each phase of project, and arrange for assignment of project personnel and make recommendations to the RAC Director.
- Be responsible for supervision of all staff assigned to the identified LANG Project to ensure they are on schedule and within budget and make reports to the RAC Director.
- Confer with state LANG project personnel to provide technical advice and resolve problems.
- Apply for grants and review funding applications to determine time frame, funding limitations, procedures for accomplishing project, staffing requirements, and allotment of available resources to various phases of project as coordinated with the RAC Director.
- Coordinate project activities with activities of LANG Technical Officer.

QUALIFICATIONS:

BS in Environmental Management Systems or a closely related field, with a minimum of four (4) years' experience in Hazard Waste Management.
